I do have a copy of the bank statement, in case anyone wants to take a look at it. If we can have the teacher re-imbursements submitted, that would be great. The box tops check also didn't come in yet.

Principal's Input: (Mrs. Pearson): First, thank you for funding the Read Around The World- it was successful and positive! We saw some new faces and it was neat to highlight some of the diverse cultures that we have in the building. It was neat to have the children realize that we can travel through books and not necessarily need to physically travel. We had our first and second grade concerts and it was wonderful. Third and fourth grade concerts are next week, the 25th. We have Field Day is coming out in May- the dates are different but the dates have been updated on E-News. Greg and I talked about a change- the last couple of years have fallen on hot days. We are bringing in a station into the one end of the gym. Parents are still welcome but precautions are going to be made. We won't have the sign in sheet for parents this year since there really isn't a purpose for that. We are currently in the throws of PSSAs. The students are doing an amazing job! End of the year picnics- we have been eliminating food during class parties due to allergies. We need to be super careful since a lot of our students have various allergies to foods. With all that being said, we are still allowing food to be part of the end of the year picnics. We have a new contractor for lawncare and we have requested that they not mow the day of or before the festival. We have a new staff member- TJ Hanze. Mr Good retired in February. Mr. Hanze is from NY and has children here at Farmdale. He is the facilities manager at a church in NY and will be able to begin in May. We are starting to think about new and exciting things for next school year- we are excited for what next year has in store!

Teacher's Input: (Mrs. Kopenhaver) A thank you from Jen Baer for the support and funds for the Read Around the World Night - it was a successful and enjoyable evening!

Also, a request from 2nd grade was made for one more Falcon Cart in June to spend the rest of their cool cash. I told them I would bring it up for discussion. (The board suggested that there be one day in June that the cart goes through the whole building to have kids cash in their tickets)

SPAC Report: notes from 4/16/19: The SPAC meeting was last night. They discussed feasibility, enrollment and attendance areas of study. There is going to be a third party walking through the schools to look at everything to see if everything makes sense with enrollment. No changes will be put into effect until at least the '20-'21 school year. Another point of discussion was lead testing. All of our schools will be tested for lead. Another bullet point was "Safe to Say Something". In January, this anonymous recording system that the state requires started. It is supposed to be an App where people can feel safe to report anything (threats, etc). They are going to present this to 7th -12th grades so they have somewhere safe to report anything that they feel is necessary to bring to someone's attention. We also discussed the district website. In August, they will be re-vamping it for the first time in 5 years so it will probably be looking different!

Old Business:

-Book Fair- Here are the numbers for the Spring book fair to report. This year Scholastic changed their bonus from 10% to 15% and started giving \$5 per teacher in gift certificates. Our sales also went up over \$2,000. Because of these Scholastic incentive changes and increased sales, we were able to earn \$2,176.47 for our school through the Scholastic dollars, gift certificates, All for books and BOGO savings. Last spring, we earned only \$635.95 Scholastic.

The \$1,509.39 Scholastic dollars will expire in 6 months. Aubrey and I are planning to go to the warehouse sale to stock up on books for Falcon cart but I'm sure there will be money left to spend in other areas.

-Hershey Park Tickets- Sold 221 admission tickets for \$7,281.94. Will be getting 22 free tickets as a result. Total profit on ticket sales is approximately \$895. We sold 43 meal tickets. We mailed everything out 3-27. As of today, we have not gotten them back to sort through and distribute.

-Family Fun Night- Mrs. Pearson kept the final count for attendance. But we had 60 rsvp and we had most of those in attendance as well as some that didn't rsvp that we were able to provide jar projects too. We had a good turnout. The presentation was engaging for the kids and parents and was COOL. The families really did a great job working together on the rainbow jars afterward and while some didn't layer as they should, everyone seemed to enjoy the project. Looking forward to a great family fun night next year.

-Room Parent - Thank you to all room parents for their help with the festival and securing volunteers. Please note: it is time to request your room parent funds. Please ask for a form in the office. This should be done sooner than later. Thank you.

-Box Tops- Coordinators just got an email yesterday explaining that Box Tops are going to be starting to go digital. The way they are showing it right now is starting June Box Tops are only going to be credited after scanning a receipt for the products that contain them. The clipped ones are still able to be used until they expire. At the moment, only the person who purchased the product is able to scan the receipt and no one else as we are limited to the amount of receipts that can be submitted. They haven't released new information on how to go about this yet. I can see this posing a problem with the fact of collection, contests, and funds in general from the Box Tops. I will of course keep updates as I get them and let you know what is going on. I should be able to make the next meeting and might have more information by then. There has been an outcry from other schools in the groups I'm involved in so we will see what happens.

New Business:

-Festival/Auction- The Festival is less than a month away. WHFD has agreed to come and bring their fire truck so the kids can get an up-close look at the equipment. We have new bounce houses and interactive games. After talking with

Papa Tater more we decided that he will position himself out side with the games and perform more of a "street show" type act which will last approximately 10 minutes. He will perform several times over the course of the night. We did secure a 6th grader to do some face painting so we will have 2 face painters. Food donation requests and volunteer requests have been sent out. Please consider signing up for a volunteer time slot and/or a baked good. We had many companies generously donate goods for the food stand so we were really able to limit what we asked of parents this year.

The silent auction collection is beginning to wind down. There are still some remaining items that will be delivered or retrieved closer to May 10th. We are very excited to welcome many new sponsors and extremely thankful for the sponsors who have agreed to donate year after year. Thank you to the Farmdale parents who donated items for our classroom baskets. We are excited to offer an opportunity for each grade to be part of our auction.
