## DUAL ENROLLMENT

- Program that allows eligible junior and senior students to concurrently enroll in college courses and receive both secondary and post-secondary credit for that coursework

# HHS DUAL ENROLLMENT ELIGIBILITY

- Junior or Senior
- 3.0 GPA or higher
- Ability to handle the rigor of a college course
- On track for graduation
- Good attendance record
- Reliable transportation

# COURSE OPTIONS

- General Education Coursework
- English, History, Math, Science
- Foreign Language
- Civics, Government, Economics, Geography
- Art, Music, Psychology, Sociology, Philosophy, Speech
- Avoid courses within your intended college major
- Check post-secondary colleges to see if they accept Dual Enrollment Credit

# GRADUATION REQUIREMENT REPLACEMENT OPTIONS

- Senior **English** only may be replaced with English Composition at the college.
- Senior **Global America** may be replaced with Intro to Macroeconomics or Intro to Microeconomics at the college.
- All other courses taken are elective credits.
- Summer courses taken at the college are NOT Dual Enrollment Credit. This must be handled through the college and student.

# SCHEDULING

- Students may take up to 2 college courses each semester
- 3 college credits per course and 1 credit for HHS
- The college courses are included in the students schedule at HHS- not exceeding 8 credits



# SCHEDULE EXAMPLE

- Block 1- Global America
  - Block 2- Calculus
  - Block 3- English 12
  - Block 4- Flex/Lunch
  - Block 5- Dual Enrollment (Speech 100)
- Students are permitted to leave after English at 12:00

# SCHEDULE EXAMPLE

- Block 1- Senior Option
  - Block 2- Dual Enrollment English 101
  - Block 3- Lunch/Flex
  - Block 4- AP Calculus
  - Block 5- Honors Chemistry
- 
- This option will only work for a senior.

# SCHEDULE EXAMPLE

- Block 1- English 12
- Block 2- Chorus/ Fundamentals of Design
- Block 3- Flex/Lunch
- Block 4- Dual Enrollment Elementary Spanish
- Block 5- Dual Enrollment Intro to Macro Economics
  
- Here students can leave after block 2 (10:35)

# SCHEDULING COLLEGE COURSES

- Students will go to the college websites to view list of course options as they apply
- Fall 2017 course schedules are only available
- Spring 2018 course schedules are usually posted in October/ November

# FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

- Family/student responsibility
- Colleges will send a bill to the student and payment must be made in order to start classes
- Payment must be made to start the college course



## GRADING

- Students earn AP weight for all Dual Enrollment Coursework
- The grade reported to the high school from the college transcript is what we will put on our high school transcript

- Most credits will transfer, but not all
