Elementary Strings Program :

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Getting Started

String instruction begins at the end of third grade with a demonstration of violin, viola, cello, and bass, h presented by your child's school string teacher. Students are encouraged to choose a string h instrument based on their preference for tone quality and range of sound. String teachers may also h make instrument recommendations based on the physical attributes of your child. h

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School ProgramhGrade 4

All fourth grade string students will receive a thirty-minute group lesson once per cycle and a thirty-h minute orchestra rehearsal once per cycle. Students who study their instruments privately may h participate in the school orchestra, and will receive occasional school instruction on those instruments h to ensure that they are able to correctly perform their orchestra music. h

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Students are expected to practice their instruments outside of school. Beginner Level string students h should log their home practice in their Beginner Folders/Books, following the directions of their h school's string teacher. h

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Students are required to perform in two concerts during their fourth grade year: a combined h concert/demonstration in the fall, and a combined elementary concert in the spring. In order for your h child to participate in the combined spring concert, he/she must have developed a basic facility with h note-reading. Your child will receive specific dates for these concerts at the beginning of the school h year. h

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School ProgramhGrades 5 & h

All fifth and sixth grade string students will receive a thirty-minute group lesson once per h cycle. Students who study their instruments privately may participate in the school orchestra, and will h receive occasional school instruction on those instruments to ensure that they are able to correctly h perform their orchestra music h

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Students who, following their first school lesson, have reached page h0 in their Essential h Elements For Strings (Book h) books, will also have a thirty-minute orchestra rehearsal once per h cycle. **Students w o, following their second school lesson, have not reached page 20 in their Essential Elements books, will be reevaluated for orchestra membership following their building's Holiday Concert in December.**

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Students are expected to practice their instruments outside of school. Intermediate, Advanced, and h Expert Level string students should log their home practice, following the directions of their school's h string teacher. h

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Students are required to perform in two concerts during the school year: a Holiday Concert h in their own elementary schools and a combined elementary concert in the spring. Your child h will receive specific dates for these concerts at the beginning of the school year. h

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More advanced students who meet specific criteria may be invited to participate in the h school's Chamber Group, which often performs in additional concerts. These criteria will be h set by each school's string teacher. h

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School Instruments

While all students are encouraged to rent an instrument, those students who would otherwise be unable to participate due to financial hardship may be able to rent a school-owned cello or bass. A limited supply of school cellos and basses is available for rental, and a \$60 annual fee, due at the beginning of the school year, will be charged for the use of a school instrument.

Students who rent school instruments must also:

- register for summer lessons, in order to keep their instruments over the summer.
- cover the cost of replacing broken strings.
- help offset the cost of major repairs caused by negligence.

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Progress Reports

Every trimester, you will receive an eReport (electronic progress report) indicating that your child is making outstanding progress, satisfactory progress, or that your child's string teacher has concerns regarding your child's progress.

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Student Responsibilities

All students are responsible for remembering to bring their instruments, method books, and/or orchestra music folders to every lesson and/or orchestra rehearsal.

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All students are responsible for remembering to attend all lessons and rehearsals.

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All students are responsible for demonstrating preparedness at lessons and rehearsals, by correctly performing their assigned pieces.

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All students are responsible for demonstrating school-appropriate behavior at lessons and rehearsals.

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Conditions for Removal from the String Program

If your child is unprepared three times within one trimester, you will be contacted by your child's string instructor to discuss whether or not your child will continue to participate in the string program.

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If your child is unable to meet academic classroom requirements, his/her classroom teacher may recommend that your child be removed from the string program due to academic difficulties.

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If your child is removed from the string program, he/she will no longer receive lessons during the school day, and will no longer participate in orchestra rehearsals/concerts associated with Hempfield's String Program.

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HEMPFIELD HINTS FOR SUCCESS!

Remind your child to practice; ask your child to perform a "mini concert" for you!

Help gather your child's materials the NIGHT BEFORE his/her lesson.

Email your child's string teacher promptly when you have questions or concerns.

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
