


The Pennsylvania Department of Education requires one standardized assessment related to the high school English Department.

At the end of the <u>10<sup>th</sup> Grade</u> English course of any level, students take the Keystone Literature exam.


Curriculum in grades 9 and 10 is aligned to eligible content for these exams and to the Pennsylvania Common Core State Standards https://www.pdesas.org/Page/Viewer/ViewPage/11/.

Students who do not score proficient or advanced on the first administration will re-take the assessment near the end of their <u>11<sup>th</sup></u> <u>Grade</u> English course.
