

- Completed an undefeated regular season by winning the Cavalcade of Bands Championship in the Patriot Open Class with a score of 95.5, including awards for best Music, best Visual, best Effect, best Color Guard, and best Percussion.

Dear Hempfield School District Community,

This fall, we had the distinct honor of hosting members of the Class of 1949 as they celebrated their 75th graduation anniversary from Hempfield High School, originally known as East Hempfield Township High School. The "Forty-Niners" gathered for a luncheon, where they reminisced about their high school days, recalling teachers by name, events they participated in, and their memorable walk across the graduation stage—now located in our current board room. What stood out most was their shared sentiment about how special the school was to them, a place where lifelong friendships were formed. Hearing their stories reinforced the importance of our work and the lasting impact that our staff and the quality of learning opportunities/experiences have on our students.

As we plan for today's students and generations to come, our school board has begun discussions on **potential building/facility projects**, with the high school as our largest priority. Architects have proposed several options, including renovating existing spaces, adding a new wing, or a combination of both. Whichever option is chosen, it's clear the building needs improvements to its infrastructure and enhanced learning spaces and safety/security systems.

The board is also committed to maintaining our other aging facilities while ensuring we remain financially responsible to our community. As we proceed, we will seek input from students, staff, and community members, as these decisions will shape the educational experience for future generations. Please keep an eye out for announcements about upcoming community meetings in the months ahead.

We're also pleased to expand our partnership with Junior Achievement of South Central PA, which provides lessons on financial literacy, career readiness, and entrepreneurship to students across elementary and secondary schools this year. These valuable lessons help students plan for their future and make informed academic and economic choices. Hempfield High School proudly celebrates the accomplishments of 14 outstanding students who have been recognized by the National Merit Scholarship Program. This year, four students have been named National Merit Semifinalists, while ten students received the honor of being National Merit Commended Students.

The National Merit Scholarship Program is a prestigious academic competition in the United States that highlights high-achieving high school students. Eligible students take the PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) in their junior year, and based on their scores, they may earn recognition at different levels.

Students named National Merit Semifinalists represent less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors and include the highest-scoring entrants in each state. These students may advance in the program as Finalists, gaining eligibility to compete for National Merit Scholarships.

Commended Students, while not advancing to the finalist level, are honored for their exceptional academic promise, as demonstrated by their performance on the qualifying test. This recognition is a testament to their dedication and hard work.

Congratulations to all of our students for their impressive achievements and dedication to academic excellence!

The community came together to celebrate Hempfield Spirit Night at the Lancaster Stormers game! The HSD energy, support, and school spirit lit up the ballpark.






Excellence in Art Education



PSSA KEYSTONE GROWTH

Each year, many students in grades 3-12 participate in standardized testing, including the PSSA and Keystone Exams at the secondary level. These assessments provide valuable insights into each student's areas of strength and areas for growth. Additionally, the Keystone Exams are a graduation requirement.

In November, the state released the assessment results and growth scores from the 2024 state assessments. We're proud to share

that Hempfield students have demonstrated remarkable growth in several areas. Highlights include:

- Marked improvements in our 8th-grade achievement and growth scores
- Most Math achievement scores have returned and surpassed pre-pandemic levels
- Strong performance on Keystone Exams, particularly in student growth scores in Math and Biology

While celebrating these successes, our team remains committed to identifying and addressing areas for improvement to ensure all students achieve their fullest potential across all grades and subjects. Preparing for Kindergarten with Preschool Connections Club


The leap from preschool to kindergarten can be challenging for students and their families. Fortunately, our Preschool Connections Club is designed to make this transition as smooth as possible! Any preschool-aged child who will attend kindergarten in the Hempfield School District during the 2025-26 school year is invited to join Preschool Connections Club alongside a parent, guardian, or caregiver at their future school building.

Preschool Connections Club sessions will include engaging activities such as read-alouds, literacy tips, introductions to staff and facilities, and more. Reading Specialists at each location will also provide takehome resources to help families prepare for the kindergarten journey.

All Preschool Connections Club events are listed on the district calendar and on our website at hempfieldsd.org/preschoolconnections. Please note that some buildings require an RSVP, so be sure to check the website for details.

Kindergarten Registration Information for the 2025-26

If your child will be five years old before September 1, they are eligible to start kindergarten in the fall of 2025. Online enrollment opens in mid-January and should be completed by Monday, February 17, 2025.

For families without internet access, please contact the Enrollment Office at (717) 459-9009 to schedule a time to use a district computer. To complete registration, parents/guardians will need to provide a photo ID, proof of residency, a copy of the child's birth certificate, and immunization records.

After registration, parents/guardians are invited to attend Kindergarten Orientation Night at the school assigned to your attendance area.

New School Resource Officer Joins Our Team!

With an increase in nationwide threats earlier this school year, our commitment to proactive safety measures has never been more crucial. We are excited to welcome East Hempfield Township Police Officer Kyle Brown as the newest member of our safety and security team!

Officer Brown will focus primarily on building strong, positive relationships with students at both middle schools, where he will serve as a mentor, role model, and advocate for a safe learning environment. He will also work closely with HHS Officer Stamm and the rest of the school safety team at the high school.

As a dedicated member of the East Hempfield Township Police Officer (EHTPD) for ten years, Officer Brown brings a wealth of experience, including roles as a defensive tactics instructor, firearms instructor, and former member of the Lancaster County SERT Team.

Flexible Instruction Days

There are no built-in "snow days" for the 2024-2025 school year. Flexible instruction days, also known as FIDs, provide an alternative approach to delivering instruction and will be used in the event of severe weather or other circumstances that prevent in-person instruction. Hempfield School District is approved for five FIDs during this school year. If more than five FIDs are necessary, additional school days will be added beyond the last student day on June 4.

The **girls' volleyball team** went undefeated, 14-0, in the regular season and captured a record 8th consecutive, and 23rd overall Lebanon-Lancaster League title over rival Manheim Township. They also won their 6th consecutive and record 17th overall PIAA District III championship and advanced to the state semifinals.



Hempfield **boys' soccer team** finished 16-4-1, and won the Lancaster-Lebanon League title for the first time in 14 years. Senior Julian Reisig scored two thrilling game-winning goals in overtime to beat Cocalico 1-0 in the semifinals, and Warwick 1-0 in the finals.



The **girls' tennis team** had a successful season, going 11-1 in the regular season. They finished 4th place in the PIAA District III 3A Tournament and qualified for the PIAA State Tournament. Hempfield's duo of Alex Gregory & Rose Wendel were Lancaster-Lebanon League and PIAA District III 3A Doubles Champions and advanced to states.

Annual Notice to Parents/Guardians
