About Us

Hempfield School District is comprised of 11 schools in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. Hempfield High School is located in Landisville, Pennsylvania and serves a relatively large community of approximately 46,000 residents living in a 44-square mile area. Citizens reside in East Hempfield and West Hempfield Townships or the boroughs of East Petersburg and Mountville, all of which comprise the Hempfield School District.

Curriculum

Hempfield High School is a comprehensive, four-year school with a diversified curriculum to challenge the capabilities of every student. Efforts are made to stimulate independent thought, self-expression, self-discipline, and a respect for all learning experiences.

College Preparatory Program

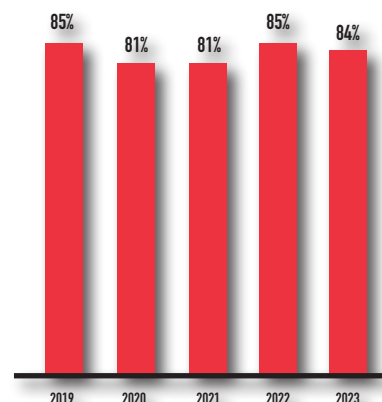

Extracurricular Activities

During the 2022-23 school year, more than 1,400 students participated in PIAA interscholastic athletics in grades 7-12. The Hempfield School District competes in the Lancaster-Lebanon League and sponsors 28 senior high and 15 junior high interscholastic athletic teams for a total of 43 teams. These teams provide opportunities for females and males to participate in baseball, basketball, bowling, cheerleading, cross country, field hockey, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis, track and field, volleyball, unified track and field, and wrestling.

Twenty-five (25) service clubs meet to provide activities for 819 students. This includes 250 students who participate in National Honor Society, National Art Honor Society, Student Council, Varsity Club, and class Steering Committees. Also, all 2000+ students are provided the opportunity to take part in WIN5 clubs/activities.

More than 350 students participate in twelve music performance ensembles including: concert bands, choirs, orchestras, jazz band, color guard, percussion, and marching band. A music honor society and student leadership program allows for the development of leadership skills. A school musical, a dance theatre production, and the Student Council Variety Show offer enrichment in theatre arts for approximately 300 students.
